UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG COURSE DROP SCHEDULE

January 4 – Final date to pay fees without a late payment fee being charged for all courses which begin in the 2018 Winter Term.
January 4-17 – Period when 2018 Winter Term course registration, course adds/drops and section changes occur.
March 1 – Final date to withdraw without academic penalty from courses, which begin in January 2018 and end in April of the 2018 Winter Term.

MISSED DEADLINES

Students who miss the test have no automatic rights to a make-up. You **MUST** have the instructor's permission. A make-up date may be scheduled under exceptional circumstances. The instructor must be notified within 24 hours of the missed deadline AND...

For medical conditions, you must provide an attending physician's or counselor's statement. For non-medical circumstances, you must provide appropriate documentation.
